School Board Update



Summary of School Board Committee Meetings Provided by Committee Members

October 2007

Education Committee

submitted by DEBORAH ROLLINS

The Education Committee met on October 9th. Several members of the public expressed concern about class sizes at Valley Forge Elementary School. The administration reviewed practices used by the District for including students in total class-size counts. Several Committee members discussed the process whereby the current class size policy was approved and is applied. The Committee noted that a class size discussion will be on the agenda for the November 13th Education Committee meeting.

The administration presented the latest K-4 enrollment trend data from the Pennsylvania Economy League (PEL). The latest data projects a growth in K-4 enrollment over the next two years, followed by a steady decrease in the total District K-4 population.

The Committee heard a presentation on space utilization projections for all schools. The administration discussed possible reassignments of existing programs and space utilization to accommodate evolving elementary space needs and reported that space needs for the elementary schools can be accommodated throughout the five year period. At the middle level, additional small group space will be needed. The Committee recommended that the Facilities Committee review a possible renovation at the middle school level to provide more small group space. Conestoga High School's space capacity is sufficient to meet program needs through 2011-2012.

Finally, the Committee reviewed and accepted the 2008-2009 school calendar. The calendar is available on the T/E School District web site at www.tesd.net.

Facilities Committee

The Facilities Committee met on October 19th. The Committee heard an update on District construction projects and change orders. Next, the Committee and

the administration discussed the current capital project summary and accompanying schedules.

The administration reviewed the revised infrastructure report. The cost of the smaller projects moved to the general fund is estimated to be approximately \$450,000. There are also infrastructure projects planned which will be paid out of the Capital Project Fund. These projects are under review for the summer of 2008

The Committee heard an update on recycling in the District. The administration will research the possibility of purchasing a recycling "compactor" to reduce the amount of space needed for recycling.

The Committee chose the style of sign for fire lanes at District buildings. The towing company that will tow cars parked in the fire lanes will begin periodically driving through the District.

The District architect presented plans for the future renovation of the music area at T/E Middle School. After receiving feedback, the architect will present at the November meeting a revised music room plan to incorporate a renovation of the courtyard as additional educational space.

The Committee discussed the installation of a scoreboard at D'Ambrosio Field. The sign will be installed sometime this fall.

Finance Committee

The Finance Committee met on October 15th. The discussions that led to Board Priority Discussions included:

1. 2008-2009 Budget Resolution: The administration announced that they can prepare and present a budget for next year that will stay below the state index of 4.4 %. This means that the District would not apply for any exceptions under ACT 1 for 2008-09. The 2008-09 budget workshops are scheduled for March 3 and March 31, 2008.

2. Senior Tax Rebate Proposal: The initial proposal is multi-faceted and includes a rebate program for low income senior citizens that could match the PA State rebate program up to dollar for dollar. The Act 50 option of approving tax deferment was discussed and will be included in the proposal.

The Committee also approved entering an agreement for an automated substitute placement service. The system is web-based and requires no in-house support for hardware or software. This results in a cost savings to the District and a more timely and reliable system for securing our daily substitutes.

The Committee reviewed the tax appeals that have been submitted as of the annual deadline of August 15th. Our staff identified the potential for lost tax revenue resulting from the appeals and gave information on the historical impact of tax appeals.

The debt analysis for the District was presented, which included various levels of borrowing to finance future capital projects. Based on current rates, it does not appear advantageous for the District to incur debt.

The State Audit Exit Conference was held on October 4th. The Audit for 2003 through 2007 has been completed and the final report has not yet been received. The oral report indicates a clean financial and operational audit. The District was also subject to a technology audit and likewise a final report was not yet received. Districts have not been given any criteria on which the technology audit is based to prepare for the evaluation. This concern has been communicated to the Office in charge of the audit.

Chester County's Reverse 911 emergency call system was the next topic of discussion. After hearing detailed information on what is available through Chester Co, the Committee has requested that the Safety Committee determine the viability of using the County system and the benefits of having our own system.

Policy Committee

The Policy Committee met on October 16th. The Committee recommended Policy 5445, Physical and Dental Examinations for a second reading by the full Board at its regular meeting on October 22nd. The Committee decided that Policy 9330, Formulation of New and Revisions of Existing Board Policies, will not be sent to the full Board for a second reading until Policy 9332, Exceptions to Board Policies, has had a

first reading by the full Board. In addition, Policy 5116, Nonresident Students, will not be sent to the full Board for a second reading until a draft Escrow Policy is developed and reviewed.

The Committee recommended the following policies for a first reading by the full Board at its regular meeting on October 22nd: Policy 9332, Exceptions to Board Policies; and Policy 3293, Designation of Depositories.

The Committee heard an overview of the legal discovery procedures and the District's need for a policy dealing with record retention and management. This topic will be discussed by the Committee at a future meeting.

Public Information Committee

The Public Information Committee met on October 9. The Committee reviewed options in the community for senior citizens who need assistance completing the Pennsylvania property tax/rent rebate form. The District is advertising the Business Office telephone number as a point of contact for seniors who need information about local assistance programs. The Committee asked the administration to create a flyer for local senior centers informing them of tax form preparation programs.

The Committee heard an informational presentation on the development of a social norming program for secondary students.

The law requires that an annual Act 1 homestead exclusion application letter be sent. The administration will review the details of the requirements and will review a draft letter with the Committee next month.

Several publications of the District were submitted to the Pennsylvania School Board Association Publications Contest. The Committee reviewed the judges' comments and found them beneficial. The recommendation was that the Administration submit publications to the contest again next year.

There will be another Board Talk taped in late October or early November for showing in mid-November or early December. Segments will include the senior tax rebate assistance program, budget development time line, middle states evaluation process and the new school administrators.

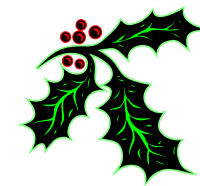
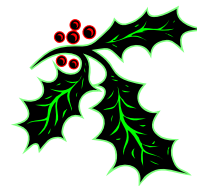
Did you know?
